# Your year, one *season* at a time

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Not a forecast. Every year the Sun walks the same twelve seasons in the same order, and your chart is not evenly spread across them. Six of the twelve hold something of yours and six hold nothing at all. This is a map of which weeks of the calendar actually have material in them.

# What a chart without a *time* can still tell you

Your birth time is unknown, which removes a real part of the chart. I would rather put that on page two than quietly print degrees I cannot stand behind. Here is exactly what is gone and exactly what survives.

## NOT IN THIS DOCUMENT

### The houses, and the four angles

No Ascendant, so no read on how you arrive.  
No Midheaven, so nothing about public life.  
No houses, so no rooms for the planets to sit in.  
The Moon moves up to 13 degrees a day, so 27 Capricorn is close but not exact.

## FULLY INTACT

### Every planet, every sign, every degree

All ten planets plus Chiron and the Node, by sign and degree.  
Every aspect between them, at full accuracy.  
The element and modality balance of the whole chart.  
Which calendar weeks your chart is loaded into, which is what this document is.

## WHY THE SEASON MAP SURVIVES IT

Houses answer where in your life something happens. Seasons answer when in the year it gets lit. The second question only needs the degree of each planet and the date the Sun reaches it, and both of those are fixed by your birth date alone. A missing time does not blur this document by a single day.

***So this is the half of the chart that is completely solid, read at full confidence, with nothing invented to fill the gap.***

## ELEMENT BALANCE

Five points in earth and four in fire, against two in air and one in water. You are built to make things concrete and to run hot while doing it. Almost nothing in the chart is soft.

## MODALITY BALANCE

Heavily fixed: Leo, Scorpio and Aquarius carry five points between them. Fixed signs do not change direction under pressure. They wait it out.

## IF YOU FIND THE TIME

A birth certificate or hospital record adds the houses and the angles. Nothing on the following pages would change, it would only gain a second layer.

# Twelve seasons, *six* of them empty

One row per season, in the order the year runs. No house column, because there is no birth time. The bar shows how much of your chart that stretch of the calendar touches.

# Half your chart lands in *six weeks*

Leo and Virgo run back to back, and between them they hold five of your thirteen points. Add the Capricorn stack in January and three seasons carry eight. Your year is not evenly weighted, it is front loaded into late summer.

## LEO SEASON

Jul 23 - Aug 22

### Your birthday season, and the wound sits five days before it

Mercury retrograde at 6 in late July, Chiron at 14 on August 6, the Sun at 19 on August 11.

Three points inside two weeks, and the order matters. The thinking goes internal first, the sore spot gets lit next, and your birthday arrives last. Every year the run-up to it is harder than the day itself, and every year that is the chart rather than the circumstances.

## VIRGO SEASON

Aug 23 - Sep 22

### The good month, immediately after the hard one

Venus at 5 on August 28, Jupiter at 17 on September 9.

The two easiest planets in the sky, both in earth, both in the four weeks straight after your birthday. September is when things get better for you, reliably, and it is worth knowing that in August rather than finding out in hindsight.

## CAPRICORN SEASON

Dec 22 - Jan 19

### Where the feeling finally shows up

Uranus 14 and Neptune 16 in the first week of January, then the Moon at 27 around January 17.

Your Moon is the only strongly personal point outside late summer, and it sits in the most reserved sign in the zodiac. Mid January is the one stretch where the interior gets any airtime, and Capricorn will make you earn it rather than volunteer it.

## AQUARIUS SEASON

Jan 20 - Feb 18

### The one that sits directly opposite you

Saturn at 14 Aquarius, in early February, five degrees from an exact opposition to your Sun.

Saturn opposite the Sun is the built-in argument between what you want and what is allowed. It is the second fixed point in your year, six months from your birthday, and it tends to arrive as an obligation you did not choose.

## THE RHYTHM UNDERNEATH

Two blocks, six months apart. Late July into September is the long one: hard first, then easy, six straight weeks with something of yours in it every week. Early January into early February is the short one, and it is colder, more interior and more obligated. Everything between mid September and late December is genuinely open.

# Six seasons with *nothing* in them

Aries, Taurus, Cancer, Libra, Sagittarius and Pisces hold zero of your thirteen points. That is half the calendar. Three of the four cardinal seasons are empty, and so is three quarters of the water.

SEPTEMBER 23 TO DECEMBER 21 · THE LONG OPEN STRETCH

Libra, Scorpio and Sagittarius run three months with one point between them, Pluto, which is generational and slow. After the intensity of late summer the whole autumn is genuinely quiet. Nothing is being asked of you, which is a different feeling from nothing happening, and it is easy to mistake one for the other.

*This is the part of the year you can spend on somebody else's calendar without losing any of your own.*

THE MISSING WATER · CANCER AND PISCES

## No season for the soft response

Pluto in Scorpio is your only water, and it is a generational placement rather than a personal one. Two of the three water seasons are empty, so the months built for tending and dissolving have nothing of yours to activate. You do those things by decision, never by instinct.

THE MISSING STARTS · ARIES AND LIBRA

## Spring asks and gets no answer

Both equinox seasons are empty. Aries is the season of beginning and Libra the season of balancing, and your chart sits out both. With five fixed points, you are built to sustain something rather than to start it or to renegotiate it halfway.

TAURUS AND SAGITTARIUS · THE OTHER TWO

Both empty, and both sitting next to a loaded season, which is what makes them useful. Taurus in May is the four weeks before Gemini lights your Mars and your Node, and Sagittarius in December is the four weeks before the Capricorn stack. Neither is a dead month so much as a run-up. If there is a version of you that plans, those are the two windows where planning costs nothing.

# Two loaded blocks and a wide open *autumn*

Your year has an unusually clear shape. Late July through mid September is dense, and it runs in a fixed order every time: the thinking turns inward, the sore spot gets lit, your birthday arrives, and then Venus and Jupiter show up in the four weeks straight after. The difficult part comes first and the easy part comes second, always in that order.

Then the calendar opens. From late September to late December there is one slow generational point and nothing else. That is a full quarter with no personal weather, which is rare and worth using deliberately rather than filling by default.

The second block is January into early February, and it is the harder one to read because it is quiet rather than loud. Your Moon is the only personal point out there, in the most reserved sign in the zodiac, and Saturn sits opposite your Sun a few weeks later. Neither announces itself. Both do real work.

## FOUR THINGS TO ACTUALLY DO WITH THIS

**Do not judge the year in the first week of August.** Chiron lands five days before your birthday, every year. It is the schedule, not the situation.

**Put the ask in September.** Venus and Jupiter, back to back, in the four weeks after your birthday. Nothing else in your year is that favourable.

**Treat October and November as borrowed time.** A whole quarter with nothing personal in it. Spend it on other people's projects without cost.

**Expect the February obligation.** Saturn opposite your Sun arrives as something required of you. Knowing the month takes the surprise out of it.

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*No birth time, and the year still has a shape this clear. The houses would add a second layer. They would not change one date on this map.*
